The Ewa Town Center Location will bring expanded redemption service to the growing Ewa Plain. This new site is near Longs Drugs at 91-1401 Fort Weaver Road, is also open seven days a week, 9 am to 5 pm, and closed from noon to 1:30 pm.

Both of these new redemption centers will also buy aluminum, copper and brass scrap metals.

“It is exciting to be able to open these redemption centers to bring recycling convenience to new areas, and or, expand service in an area already served. Reynolds has operated an Ewa Beach recycling center for approximately twenty years, and the Ewa plain has seen such tremendous growth that an additional recycling location was needed. The Aala Street location will also serve an area that has not had a redemption center nearby.
