Reynolds Recycling Brings Recycling Convenience to Waikiki

Honolulu-Reynolds Recycling officially opened its 22nd redemption center on Oahu at the gateway to Waikiki. Located across from the Hawaii Convention Center and next to the Hard Rock Café, this certified redemption center will make it convenient for Waikiki and downtown residents to recycle not only their HI-5 recyclables, but their scrap metal as well.

“We feel very strongly that this location will provide valuable recycling services to the thousands of residents who live and work nearby. Given its convenient location and close proximity to downtown Honolulu, we expect this to be among our busiest locations,” stated Terry Telfer, President of Reynolds Recycling.

Reynolds Recycling currently handles about 90,000 transactions a month at its 28 locations on Oahu, Maui and Kauai, with plans to open redemption centers on the Big Island during the coming year. “Having invested millions of dollars into infrastructure improvements and staffing, Reynolds is striving to maintain a high level of customer service at all of its locations, including our newest site in Waikiki,” noted Telfer.

Customers will be able to enjoy HI-5 and scrap metal recycling services at the following location during the designated days and times:

For 25 years, Reynolds Recycling has been protecting and preserving Hawaii’s natural environment by removing recyclables from the waste stream. In 2005 alone, Reynolds recycled over 22 million pounds of recyclables. That equals enough cubic yards of landfill space to extend the life of Waimanalo Gulch by almost an entire month.
